

VBS is also a great opportunity to teach kids what God is doing in the lives of children around the world and how to care for the needs of these children. This is where GlobalFingerprints steps in. We designed the following pages as a supplement to the VBS program you chose. The stories found in the following pages are for use in times where you highlight a missions organization and encourage your kids to give. Highlight countries in your large group setting, show videos, and choose the activities that make the most sense to add or to replace some of what you are already doing. Thank you for partnering with us to make a difference in the lives of children here and around the world!

### **Goal of GlobalFingerprints children's ministry project:**

To connect American children with children around the world by opening their eyes to the needs of their brothers and sisters and giving them an opportunity to care for others.

Children have an opportunity to care by giving money to help provide a hopeful future for children across the globe.

### **Why GlobalFingerprints?**

GlobalFingerprints is the child-sponsorship ministry of the Evangelical Free Church of America. Through GlobalFingerprints, and the hands-on care of local congregations, children are fed, educated, nurtured spiritually and cared for medically.

GlobalFingerprints partners in countries and areas not serviced by other sponsorship organizations. The efforts of GlobalFingerprints start with the local church within the country, moving beyond complicating factors of civil unrest and persecution. Children are identified by the local church and needs are met through whatever means the local church sees as the most successful within the cultural context. Countries currently served through GlobalFingerprints include: Democratic Republic of Congo, Liberia, Zambia, Haiti, Panama, India, Myanmar, Indonesia, and Lebanon. In some of these countries, the gospel is direct, in others the local leaders need to take creative approaches to build relationships and spread the love of Christ.

GlobalFingerprints is a unique partnership between the country's local church and American churches.

This summer, make a difference in the lives of children hidden away from the eyes of many.



## School Tools

GlobalFingerprints children's ministry project allows us to make a difference beyond child sponsorship.

## Day 1: Intro

(Show intro video)

This year we are partnering with GlobalFingerprints to help kids around the world get what they need for school.

**Ask:** What things do you need for school? (allow kids to answer)

### GAME

**Supplies** — Two backpacks and basic school supplies (lunch box, notebooks, text books, pencils, paper, crayons, scissors for each backpack).

**Play** — Select two teams of kids (perhaps each team could be a child from each grade level at VBS). Set up starting and finish lines. Have the children run a relay where they take one supply to the backpack and pack it for school. Have a simple prize for each team (e.g., a box of crayons per person, pencil, or the music CD from your VBS).

**Ask** — How many of you enjoy getting a new box of crayons or colored pencils for school? Can you imagine living somewhere where these supplies were hard to find? Can you imagine not having the supplies you need for school?

### LESSON


For kids around the world, this is their reality. School for these kids costs money to attend. Schools are often very simple like this mud hut (show picture). Schools lack textbooks and basic supplies. (Show picture of the inside of a school). Many times, there are no chalk boards and no paper. Kids have to memorize all their work.

What can you do? This week you can bring allowance money or raise money to donate to the GlobalFingerprints School Tools project and help a child on another continent go to school. Your money can buy books, paper and pay for tuition (show pictures of items).

## Day 2: Africa

This week, we are partnering with GlobalFingerprints to bring School Tools to kids around the world. Today, we will look at the impact of School Tools for kids in Africa.

GlobalFingerprints works with three countries in Africa: Congo, Zambia, and Liberia. (Show a map of Africa with arrows pointing at the three countries and show Africa video)

### GAME

**Supplies** — two bowls, whipped cream, several Lego people, two schools made from Legos with no roof, washcloths to wipe up kids after the game, a table, and a tarp for under the table.

**Play** — Choose two students to come up on stage and get the kids to school. How to play: Bury Lego people in whipped cream in a bowl and have the kids use only their mouths find the Lego people in the bowl and drop them into their designated school. You can either time the kids and see who gets the most kids to school in one minute and declare a winner, or end the game when all the kids get to school. Have a simple prize for each team (e.g., a box of crayons per person, pencil, or the music CD from your VBS).

### LESSON

(Show map of Africa)


Getting to school can be a real challenge for kids in Africa (Show slide of kids walking to school). They need to pay tuition, buy uniforms, and bring all of their own supplies. This is very difficult for families and many times only one child from a family will get to attend school.

Some of the most needed items for kids in Africa are curricula for the teachers to teach from, uniforms, and shoes. (Show next two slides of these items)

Thank you for helping kids get what they need to go to school. You have raised \_\_\_\_\_ (tell the kids your amount). (Show a picture of the thermometer gauge and how it is climbing to your total goal).

## Day 3: Latin America

Remember, we are partnering with GlobalFingerprints to bring School Tools to kids around the world. Today, we will talk about how we can help kids in Latin America.

GlobalFingerprints works with two countries in Latin America: Haiti and Panama (show a map with arrows pointing at the two countries and show Latin America video)



### GAME

**Supplies** — 1-2 sets of uniform-type clothing. Make sure they are big sizes. Thrift stores and men's clothing stores are great options.

**Play** — Choose 1-2 teams of students to come up on stage and have a relay getting dressed in uniform. A team of 4-5 volunteers will have one uniform. Play high energy music and set the clock for 1-2 minutes, depending on the amount of time available. Have kids stand on one side of the stage with the box containing the uniform. Explain that each child will get a chance to put the uniform on over their clothes, run to the other side of the stage to give you a "high five," then run back and take the uniform off. The next person in line will do the same. If they beat the clock, they win! Have a simple prize for each team (e.g., a box of crayons per person, pencil, or the music CD from your VBS).

With two teams and two uniforms (4-5 on each team and the same rules), the team that finishes first wins.


### LESSON

(Show map of Latin America)

Great job! Thank you for helping each other get into uniform for school. In Latin American countries, uniforms are very important. You often can't go to school without them and you have to buy them yourself. Your money raised will make a difference as those children will be able to buy a uniform. Thank you for making a difference! (Show picture of uniformed kids)

Thank you for helping kids get what they need to go to school. You have raised \_\_\_\_\_ (tell the kids your amount). (Show a picture of the thermometer gauge and how it is climbing to your total goal).

## Day 4: Asia

Thank you for partnering with GlobalFingerprints to bring School Tools to kids around the world. Today, we will talk about how kids who will be impacted in Asia.

GlobalFingerprints works with three countries in Asia: India, Myanmar, and Indonesia (show a map with arrows pointing at the two countries and show Asia video)

### GAME

**Supplies** — 1-2 textbooks, one big and one small if you want to demonstrate inequity.

**Play** — Choose 1-2 teams of students to come up on stage and have a relay balancing a text book on their head from one side of the stage to the other. How to play: if one team and one book (choose 4-5 volunteers): play high energy music and set the clock for 1-2 minutes depending on how much time you have. Have kids stand on one side of the stage with their text book. Explain that each child will get a chance to carry the textbook on their head to the other side of the stage and give you a 'high five' then carry the book and run back and hand it to the next person in line. If they beat the clock, they win! Have a simple prize for each team (e.g., a box of crayons per person, pencil, or the music CD from your VBS)

If two teams and two books (choose twice as many volunteers): play high energy music and explain the relay race. Same rules as above. The team that finishes first wins.

(Optional: you can use two different size books, making it easier for one team, then talk about how the kids we are helping with our offering money have a disadvantage to kids who have money of their own. When kids have what they need, they thrive! When they don't, it is a struggle.)


### LESSON

(Show map of Asia) Awesome job! You're helping get kids the necessary books. In Asia, kids have to buy their own textbooks. Books can be very expensive. You are making a difference and helping a child learn.

Thank you for helping kids get what they need to go to school. (Show three slides of kids studying). (Show a picture of the thermometer gauge and how it is climbing to your total goal). Keep up the great work!

Note: if this is your last day! Congratulate the kids for their efforts this week and celebrate what they raised (even if they didn't quite make the goal).





## Day 5: Middle East

We are excited to partner with GlobalFingerprints and their work in the Middle East. GlobalFingerprints is working with the local church in Lebanon to bring love and Jesus to Syrian refugees. (Show a map with arrows pointing to Lebanon and Syria and the Middle East video)

### GAME

**Supplies** — One tray full of as many different school supplies as you can come up with (e.g., pencil, eraser, post-its, paper clip, binder clip, pen, notebook, book, and white out). This can be an all play game or you can bring some kids up on the stage to play.

**Play** — Explain to the group or kids on stage: You will see a tray full of school supplies. Look at them and then I will take them away. Once they are put away you will have one minute to write down as many supplies as you saw.

For those on stage, show the kids the tray for 10 seconds and then give them paper to write. The child with the most items written down wins. If you are having all the small groups play, take a picture in advance of your tray and display the tray on a screen for 10 seconds. Then, give the groups one minute to write down supplies. The group with the most items wins. Have a simple prize for each team (e.g., a box of crayons per person, pencil, or the music CD from your VBS)

### LESSON

(Show map of Middle East) Kids in Lebanon face many challenges. These children are Syrian refugees, which means they have had to leave their own country of Syria because it was no longer safe due to war. These kids have had to leave so much behind. (Show photo of apartment building) They don't have school supplies. They often can't find a safe school to go to in Lebanon and are bullied by Lebanese children. The church in Lebanon is trying to make a difference by providing a safe learning center and the chance to know Jesus. (Show two slides of kids in playground and classroom) Your donations will help kids get the supplies they need to learn.

Thank you for helping these kids! You have raised \_\_\_\_\_ (tell the kids your amount). (Show a picture of the thermometer gauge and how it is climbing to your total goal). Thank you for making a difference in the lives of kids in several countries! Congratulations on a job well done this week! You are a blessing by providing the School Tools and education children need.
